

CAROL MORRIS JUNIOR UMPIRE AWARD

Carol Morris (affectionately known as the Little General) - [1951 - 1998]

- At the time of Carol's passing Carol was the Technical Convenor for NSW Women's Hockey Association and the leading Junior Umpires Coach in the state
- Involved with forming the CR Blues Club, Penrith, that played in the Western District Women's Competition in 1979
- Western District Women's Association President 1981 to 1986, the Secretary 1987 to 1989.
- Carol had a passion for umpiring and realised that the young needed to be coached into becoming excellent umpires and to enjoy umpiring as well. Organised and coached the Under 14 and Under 16 aspiring umpires at the Easter Coaching clinics and other venues around the state. Carol held a State A Umpires Grade badge
- Became involved with forming the Sydney Women's Hockey League
- Member of the NSW Umpires Committee from 1980 to 1989 and carried out the allocation of umpires to State Championships and evolved into a Technical Official for significant events. Supported the NSW Women's Indoor Hockey movement by participating as an umpire, team manager and technical official
- Supported the Women's Veterans Hockey movement when emerged on then mid 1980's

- Pam was a dedicated member of NSWVHA and umpired in the early days when sport commenced being played on artificial surfaces at Homebush. HNSW awarded Pam with a Meritorious badge for her, not only dedication to umpiring, but to technical and also her assistance selling souvenirs for HNSW for many years.
- Pam continued her umpiring and training umpires up and until her passing and was always an umpire at State Masters Hockey since 1984 for both the Womens and then the NHA.
- A final tribute to which Pam would have been delighted, albeit embarrassed was the naming of this Trophy in her honour.

Notes to the Financial Statements

Nepean Hockey Association For the year ended 30 September 2022

1. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

The financial statements are special purpose financial statements prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act NSW. The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historic costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except where stated specifically, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless stated otherwise, have been adopted in the preparation of these financial statements.

Property, Plant and Equipment (PPE)

Leasehold improvements and office equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

The depreciable amount of all PPE is depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

Leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

Impairment of Assets

At the end of each reporting period, the committee reviews the carrying amounts of its tangible and intangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indication exists, an impairment test is carried out on the asset by comparing the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs to sell and value in use, to the asset's carrying amount. Any excess of the asset's carrying amount over its recoverable amount is recognised in the income and expenditure statement.

Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the association has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflow can be reliably measured. Provisions are measured at the best estimate of the amounts required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting period.

Cash on Hand

Cash on hand includes cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

Accounts Receivable and Other Debtors

Accounts receivable and other debtors include amounts due from members as well as amounts receivable from donors. Receivables expected to be collected within 12 months of the end of the reporting period are classified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.

These notes should be read in conjunction with the attached compilation report.

Notes to the Financial Statements

**Revenue and Other Income**

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed. For this purpose, deferred consideration is not discounted to present values when recognising revenue.

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument. Dividend revenue is recognised when the right to receive a dividend has been established.

Grant and donation income is recognised when the entity obtains control over the funds, which is generally at the time of receipt.

If conditions are attached to the grant that must be satisfied before the association is eligible to receive the contribution, recognition of the grant as revenue will be deferred until those conditions are satisfied.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax.

Leases

Leases of PPE, where substantially all the risks and benefits incidental to the ownership of the asset (but not the legal ownership) are transferred to the association, are classified as finance leases.

Finance leases are capitalised by recording an asset and a liability at the lower of the amounts equal to the fair value of the leased property or the present value of the minimum lease payments, including any guaranteed residual values. Lease payments are allocated between the reduction of the lease liability and the lease interest expense for that period.

Leased assets are depreciated on a straight-line basis over the shorter of their estimated useful lives or the lease term. Lease payments for operating leases, where substantially all the risks and benefits remain with the lessor, are charged as expenses in the periods in which they are incurred.

Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO). Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the assets and liabilities statement.

Financial Assets

Investments in financial assets are initially recognised at cost, which includes transaction costs, and are subsequently measured at fair value, which is equivalent to their market bid price at the end of the reporting period. Movements in fair value are recognised through an equity reserve.

Accounts Payable and Other Payables

Accounts payable and other payables represent the liability outstanding at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the association during the reporting period that remain unpaid. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of recognition of the liability.

2. Prior Year Adjustment - Grant Expenses

An adjustment was made to the accounts to reflect a Lease Bank Guarantee Bond held as an asset of the association at the report date. An adjustment to the operating statement was necessary as the original payment to the Lease bond was treated as a grant expense. This adjustment to members' funds is required to correctly reflect the Lease Bond.

Suggestions are welcomed for improving content and engagement with posts on the NHA Facebook page.





I would like to thank Noelene Knowles and Marnie Shortis in particular for their hard work in keeping the canteen stocked and ready to go. Once again, any money made from the canteen will be reinvested in the Hockey Centre.

The operation of the Bar has been a success and thanks to all members for drinking responsibly. You might have noticed that we had some stubbie holders for sale – Thanks to Scott Williams for organising.

Our main highlight for 2022 was hosting the U34/40's Men's Masters State Championships on 8th – 10th April and a special thanks to all those that helped out to make the event a success despite the unfavourable wet weather in the weeks prior and during the tournament.

In this regard I would like to thank our 'go-to' electricians, Matt Brewin and Greg Evans for their assistance in upgrading the lights under trying conditions in the weeks leading up to the Championships. The weather was not cooperating and we almost made it without any mishaps 😊

Grants - We continue to make grant applications as they become available. Our main focus for 2022 has been to upgrade the lights to LED and unfortunately, we were unsuccessful on 2 x grant applications. We have one outstanding grant application for an Awning cover for the BBQ area (this was lodged June 2022).

We were successful in securing the grant funding for 4 x new hockey goals (\$15,540.00).

Work undertaken included the upgrades to the former canteen building, including extending the deck at the front for another viewing area and repainting the exterior to match the amenities building.

We have also been generously gifted 2 x electric hand dryers by an anonymous doner. These are due to be installed in the male and female toilets in November.

Water Field – as everyone is aware there have been some issues with movement in the playing surface which has presented some challenges to the Committee. We are currently attempting to negotiate with the installer so that the matter can be resolved however to date progress has been slower than we would have liked. We will advise further advice to members in the coming months.

I'd like to take this opportunity to thank all members of the Turf Committee – Noelene Knowles, Scott Williams, Marnie Shortis and Michael Hughes; and non-voting member Kieran Knowles - for their fantastic work and support this season. I'd also like to thank the following people for their tireless work at the Hockey Centre: Ken Knowles, Ryan Knowles, Luke Doyle and Matt Brewin.

Further to that we held a number of working bees at the centre for general tidy ups and I want to thank everyone who attended. The hockey centre is OUR FACILITY and we all need to pitch in to help keep it looking in great shape so thank you to everyone for your help.

Of course, none of this would have been possible without support from Kieran Knowles, his executive team and the wider Hockey Community – Thank you.

We look forward to the 2023 season.



