



**PRESIDENTS REPORT** 

2019 saw my first year as President of Nepean Hockey Association. I was pleased to see so many people stepping up to fill the committee roles and this transpired into a fantastic year for hockey in our area.

This year we saw the completion of the long overdue water-based pitch which will ensure we can continue to grow and develop hockey in our local area.

2019 saw our community come together to look after the maintenance of the fields with well attended working bees across the stat of the season and the turf committee taking the brunt of the maintenance after the season kicked off. The association also gained control of the canteen with all clubs stepping up to do their fair share and ensure that this vital source of income stays within NHA.

The season culminated in a series of grand finals that were as tightly contested and close as they have been in recent memory with all Grand Finals being within 2 goals. This shows the development of the players and the hard work that the clubs are putting into developing competitive teams.

This season would not have been possible without the help of my fellow executive; Jen O'Toole, Noelene Knowles, Ian Kennedy and Scott Williams. A special thank you to Ian who stepped into the vacant Secretary role part way through the season and has assisted the team greatly.

In 2019 we awarded the President's Award to Kieran Knowles. It would not be overstating the facts to say that without Kieran we would not have our new pitch. He was instrumental in securing the funding, managing the project, securing the additional funding and continues to manage the project including the upgrade of the watering system on the Hybrid field. Kieran's ongoing management of this project was fundamental in the field being delivered before the end of the season with significant delays and issues arising from past management and the initial build of the sand-based turf causing headaches throughout the process.

The Association cannot run without the dedication of the many volunteers, the clubs and their executives, the Association conveners, coaches, managers, umpires and the many other officials that undertake the often-thankless roles day-in day-out, from the administration and the day-to-day running and officiating of the games. Thank you to all involved.

In 2019 we introduced the junior Development Squads which teams up under 11 and under 13 developing players with a cohort of quality coaches from NHA who helped to build on the skills needed to progress and excel in hockey. The program was designed by our coaching convenor Kieran Knowles and implemented by our junior Development officer Sandy Eagleton to great effect with many of the participants going onto representative teams and our under 11 carnival teams.

Special mentions go to our under 11 boys who won both of their carnivals at Sutherland and Macarthur and our under 13 boys outdoor team who made it through to their semi-final in Grafton. Our 13 Girls (Parkes), 15 Girls (Wagga) and 15 Boys (Macarthur) also having strong showings throughout their championships.

An extra special mention must go to our under 18 girls who won their championships which was a culmination of hard work over the last few years with this squad.

For our opens and master's teams once again, Nepean performed admirably. Plaudits go to our Over 35 2's team which took out their championship at Bathurst which was a fantastic result.


At indoor NHA also continued to punch above their weight with our Masters men's and women's winning division 1 state championships and our under 15 boys finishing runner up.



#### **Junior Development Report 2019**

The 2019 season saw continued interest in many junior families seeking opportunities for their children to engage in training opportunities for development of hockey skills in both field hockey and indoor hockey. With the introduction of the Junior Development Squad, the association saw juniors exhibiting greater skill development in both the competition and in the association representative squads.

In 2019 we held the first 'Come and Try' sessions through a Nepean based clinic. These 2 sessions had costs covered by the Junior Development Fund and all participants were issued information about all clubs within the association, with many participants joining the 2019 junior competition. Thank you to Jo McIntyre for her suggestion for these clinics, and the support of all volunteers who helped run these early morning sessions.



The 2019 season also saw the commencement of the Junior Development Squad, which commenced in February 2019 for an 11 week period. This clinic ran on a weekly basis, providing Under 11's and Under 13's opportunities to engage in small group training sessions for skill development. Attendees paid a \$2.00 levy per session to support the field hire costs for the sessions with any remaining costs supplemented by the Junior Development Fund. Coaches for the sessions were skilled players from the Nepean Hockey Association with volunteers from Penrith RSL Hockey Club, Rooty Hill RSL Hockey Club, Penrith Panthers Hockey Club and Emu Plains Hockey Club.

There was a mixture of skills and ages, some children having played indoor before, and others giving it their first try. 


