The Turf Committee have had a challenging year but have been successful in a number of areas – highlights for the year include:

- Successful implementation of a Covid Safety Plan that allowed Hockey in our association to return. I want to thank all our clubs and members for following the rules and whilst I understand they were frustrating at times this allowed us to complete a shortened season with as little inconvenience as possible.
- Due to the Covid-19 pandemic we offered a reduced rate for NHA club training and competitions that allowed clubs to offer reduced fees for 2020 only to ensure that numbers did not drop due to the shortened season.
- The Turf Committee was able to negotiate reduction in lease fees to zero for the last 9 months of 2020 from the Western Sydney University. Discussions are ongoing for ongoing rental relief that will allow us to continue to re-invest in the hockey Centre.
- The announcement of a successful grant submission through the Greater Sydney Sports Facility Fund that will result in new clubhouse with 4 changerooms, canteen, social room, and access for people of all abilities. This is a huge development for hockey in our area and is the latest step in ensuring we have a facility the entire Nepean Hockey Association can be proud of. The new building will be open in early 2021 and this would simply have not been possible without the hard work of a number of people but in particular Patrick Hurley has done an amazing job on Grants for the Turf Committee.
- The concreting of the middle section of the two fields was completed with a mixture of grant money and proceeds from the canteen. This makes this area much more user friendly and easier to a maintain.
- We were successful in small grant to purchase new grandstands for the middle section.
- Another grant was received to upgrade the existing canteen building. This building will become an admin building for tournaments and smaller meetings. We also plan to extend the deck at the front for another viewing area.
- The Canteen was run internally by the Turf Committee in 2020 and whilst with a limit on what we could sell due to COVID-19 restrictions, we once again had a successful season. I would like to thank Noelene Knowles and Marnie Shortis in particular for their heard work in keeping the canteen stocked and ready to go. Once again, any money made from the canteen will be reinvested in the Hockey Centre.

We continue to look to the future and have applied for grants for the following works planned for the Hockey Centre;

- New goals for the Hybrid field
- Landscaping works
- Further shaded areas
